





 Specialty crops are defined as "fruits, vegetables, tree nuts, dried fruits, horticulture, and nursery crops (including floriculture)."
- Eligible Applicants
- Benefit more than one product or organization
- Maximum Award \$100k-research; \$125k- marketing, training, etc.
- In MI- 2 proposals/year/commodity group

- 2023-2024: Enhancing the Competitiveness of the Michigan Hop Industry; \$105,549 (October 2023-September 2025)
- Awardee: Hop Growers of Michigan 501(c)5 non-profit
- Objective: Increase sales of Michigan-grown hops
- The target market includes breweries and consumers in the Great Lakes region - specifically Michigan, Wisconsin, Indiana and Ohio
- The grant will be managed by Dianna Stampfler of Promote Michigan (also publicist for the Michigan Brewers Guild).

MICHIGAN HOPS

OUTCOME #1 Increasing Consumption and Consumer (Brewery) Purchasing of Specialty Crops

- Record # of brewers that receive information on Michigan hops (Trade Show attendance and direct outreach by growers).
- Survey grower members annually to determine baseline and future # of brewers buying Michigan hops
- Determine which beers are brewed with Michigan hops and market those to the general public- via media, social media and point-of-sale identification.



OUTCOME #2 Increasing Access to Specialty Crops and Expanding Specialty Crop Production and Distribution

- Survey brewers
 - # that gained knowledge and/or procured more hops, asking specifically how they heard about Michigan grown hops
 - # that purchased more Michigan-grown hops and the beers for which they were utilizing those hops.
- Survey MI hop growers: # that report selling more hops
- Encourage Michigan hop growers to register with the Michigan Craft Beverage Grower Directory - an online resource which connects growers with purchasers.


MARKETING OUTREACH - CONSUMER
